## Food Services Non-Restaurant (FNS)

### A Day in the Life

Being a Food Services Non-Restaurant Worker is a very interesting job in which to work. You do many of the same tasks that you would imagine but, in this case, they are in a different environment.

You will arrange food for serving on plates or trays according to orders or instructions. You will clean or sterilize dishes, kitchen utensils, equipment, or facilities. You will monitor food distribution, ensuring that meals are delivered to the correct recipients and that guidelines, such as those for special diets, are observed.

You will record amounts and types of special food items service to customers, You will prepare food items, such as sandwiches, salads, soups, or beverages. You might assist customers with seating arrangements. You will remove trays and stack dishes for return to kitchen after meals are finished. You will monitor food services operation to ensure that procedures are followed.

### How do I get into this top job?

This job has no formal education requirements but you will need about one month of on-the-job training to do the job. This job will let you get your foot in the door while working on your degree if you choose. Training programs and tests may be expensive, but you might not have to pay for all of it yourself. If you are low income, ask your job coach, career counselor, training program, or workforce development specialist about assisting you with your training expenses. It might be free!

This occupation is a good entry level position. The entry wage is lower, but the median wage is very close to the statewide wage. The Georgia Dept. of Labor estimates there will be 300 openings per year through 2026!
